In addition to the above, sometimes an item would be marked with a Lion Anchor G mark. The Lion indicated the item was made of silver (i.e. coin or sterling). The anchor was the symbol for Rhode Island, where Gorham was based. And the G was for Gorham. After 1847 the above marks and the single symbol Anchor are usually Electro Plated.



Prior to circa 1860-5 the lion may be found facing left.

From 1865 the lion is found facing to the right. Occasionally (circa 1850-1865) the lion is found standing on it's rear legs. Although the Lion Anchor G mark has been used by Gorham from the middle of the nineteenth century it was not registered at the US Patent Office until December 19, 1899. The trademark registration papers state that the mark had been in use since January 1, 1853.

Items with the Lion Anchor G mark made prior to 1868 are made of solid silver but not necessarily sterling (i.e., COIN). In 1868 Gorham adopted the sterling standard and any post 1868 item with the Lion Anchor G mark may be assumed to be sterling (or better).

Print Instructions

Note: We suggest that you use a heavy paper stock to print this pocket guide so that it can stand up to frequent usage.

- 1. Go to File menu and click Print....
- 2. Under *Print Range* select *Pages*. Print *From*: **1** *To*: **1**
- 3. Click on the Setup... button.
- 4. In the Orientation Box select Landscape
- 5. Click the OK button to print page 1.

- 6. Turn page 1 over and re-insert page into printer.
- 7. Go to File menu and click Print....
- 8. Under *Print Range* select *Pages*. Print *From*: **2** *To*: **2**
- 9. Click on the Setup... button.
- 10. In the Orientation Box select Landscape
- 11. Click the OK button to print page 2 (on opposite side of page 1).
- 12. Cut the along the dotted line.
- 13. Fold into thirds so that the guide is in a convenient carrying size

You may wish to laminate this pocket guide for additional sturdiness.
