In conjunction with the exhibition Silver: Paul de Lamerie from the Cahn collection, this symposium brings to life the world of de Lamerie (1688–1751), England's greatest 18th-century silversmith and one of the first to adopt the Rococo style.

Distinguished speakers will discuss de Lamerie's masterpieces and provide insights into English high society at a time when the luxury market was flourishing. Expert speakers include the exhibition's US-based curator Ellenor Alcorn, Dr Tessa Murdoch from London's Victoria & Albert Museum, and Robert Nash from the Huguenot Society of Australia.

Plus, symposium participants can join experts to handle and discuss examples of de Lamerie silver at a special session hosted by collector Paul Cahn.
