NOVEMBER ARTIFACT OF THE MONTH

The Monthly Feature for November is the original Prop Blast Mug used by the 503rd Parachute Infantry Battalion.

The first prop blast mug from WWII era was used by the 503rd Parachute Infantry Battalion. It was made from a 75mm shell casing with parachute ripcord handles welded on the side. Engraved on the mug are the names of all the participants, most notably Major R.F. Sink (later Lieutenant Colonel Sink, Commanding General XVIII Airborne Corps), Captain Yarborough (later Lieutenant General Yarborough, Commanding General, 1st Corps who designed and patented the U.S. Army parachute wings) and CPT James Gavin (later Lieutenant General Gavin, Commander of the 82d Airborne Division).

The first prop blast ceremony was conceived by Captain William P. Yarborough and First Lieutenant William T. Ryder for the 501st Parachute Infantry Battalion in 1940 as a rite of passage for new Airborne Officers. As part of the prop blast ceremony officers were required to drink a special mixture from a ceremonial mug. This tradition continues today, as newly assigned Officers are initiated into their units by way of the Prop Blast Ceremony.

The Airborne & Special Operations Museum Foundation supports the museum with marketing, advertising and financial support for its programs and exhibits. Opening the doors on August 16th, 2000, the 60th anniversary of the original United States Army's Test Platoon's first parachute jump, the museum offers free admission, a main exhibit gallery, temporary gallery, four-story tall theater, video theater and a motion simulator ride. It is located in Historic Downtown Fayetteville on the corner of Bragg Boulevard and Hay Street, adjacent to the city's Freedom Memorial Park and the recently built North Carolina Veteran's Park. The main gallery is designed as a self-quiding tour, in chronological order, through the history of the airborne and special operations soldiers, from 1940 to the present. The temporary gallery changes throughout the year and displays a myriad of exhibits pertaining to the United States Army, airborne and special operation units through their history and conflicts from World War II to the present.
